A Japanese surprise air attack devastates the U.S. Naval Base in Pearl Harbor. Heavy loses and casualties are suffered by the U.S. President Franklin Roosevelt and the U.S. Congress immediately decide that it is time to go to war with Japan. A few days later, the U.S. also declares war on Germany and Italy. Because of harsh winter conditions, the Soviet Army is able to protect Moscow and push back German soldiers. British Prime Minister Winston Churchill travels to Washington D.C. to meet with President Roosevelt and discuss war plans.

In baseball, the New York Yankees take the World Series in five games over the Brooklyn Dodgers. Stanford defeats Nebraska, 21-13, in the Rose Bowl and the Chicago Bears beat New York, 37-9 in the NFL playoffs. Also this year, Whirlaway, ridden by Eddie Arcaro, wins the Kentucky Derby and the Triple Crown. Five-year heavyweight champion Joe Louis beats Buddy Baer in the seventh round on a disqualification. Craig Wood wins golf's U.S. Open with a score of 284.
