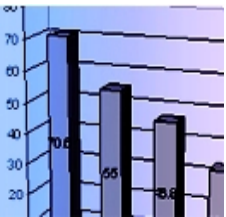

Commerce Department official William Remington resigns to defend himself against disloyalty accusations.

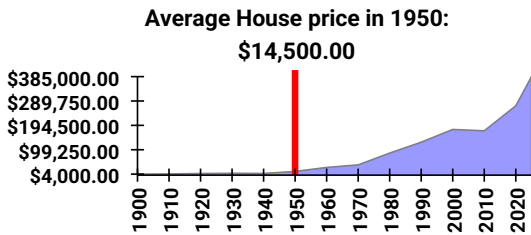

New York takes the World Series in four games straight against Philadelphia. Cleveland defeats Los Angeles 30-28 to win the NFL title. Heavyweight Ezzard Charles defeats Joe Louis in Louis' comeback bid after 15 rounds. This win gains Charles universal recognition as heavyweight champion. A. Louise Brough wins the women's tennis singles title at Wimbledon for the third straight year; Budge Patty wins the men's title. In the NBA, Minneapolis wins over Syracuse with George Mikan as the NBA scoring leader at 27.4 points per game. Middleground wins the Kentucky Derby.
