Events of the Month



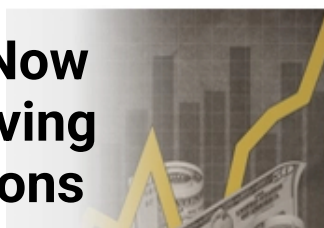

Popular Music



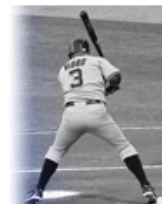
