Russian President Boris Yeltsin surprises the world on Dec. 31, resigning his post and turning power over to Prime Minister Vladimir Putin. Yeltsin, 68, tells a stunned Russia: "I am resigning ahead of time." The New Year also brings an end to the comic strip "Peanuts" as creator Charles Shultz retires after almost 50 years. Israel and Syria resume peace talks over the Golan Heights. The U.S. on Dec. 14 cedes control of the Panama Canal.

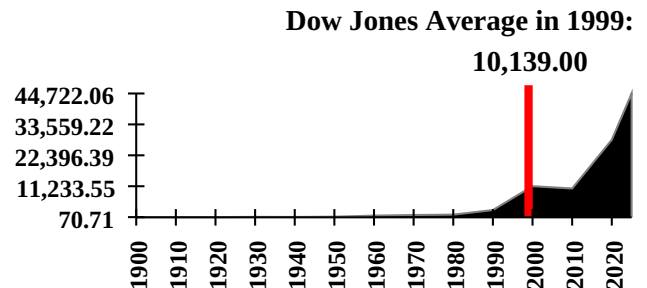
Events of the Day

The first motel, called the Motel Inn, opens in San Luis Obispo in 1925. The first satellite in orbit built by private citizens is the Discoverer XXXVI in 1961.
